

John F O'Brien was a member of an old Gorey Family and was educated at Blackrock College. On his return to Gorey he went into business on the Main Street in the same premises that his family had owned for many years. He established a Drapery, and also had a Grocery, Wines, & Spirits business. John F O'Brien lived at this premises with his wife Mary a native of Co.Tipperary in1901. He died in 1905 at the age of 39. His wife Mary moved out in 1928.

The name Funge has been part of the drapery business in Gorey since 1927. The late Tom Funge was a native of Ballintray, Courtown, where his father was foreman of the Brick & Tile Works. The Funge family were originally from the UK. Tom served his apprenticeship in Kane's of Gorey and then went to work in

Arnott's in Dublin. In 1927 he started a Drapery & Footwear business at 63 Main St Gorey which he rented from the Smith Family. These premises are now Nell Sweeney's.

He specialised in made to measure suits. Prior to 1927 he travelled around the area by bicycle selling suit lengths from door to door.

In 1932 he purchased the present premises at 17 Main St, from Aidan Mernagh a vet.

Tom Funge was also involved in Local Politics and served on both Gorey Town Commissioners and Wexford Co.Council. Tom and his wife Eileen had 3 sons.

Joe who had also worked in Arnotts joined the business in the 1960's. Over the years many changes have taken place with extensions and extra floor space and the business has flourished. Top brands are stocked in all departments. A slogan which was used during the 1960's & 70's that "There is always a bargain at Funge's" is still true today.

Paul Funge was an internationally known artist, He studied at the National College of Art & Design and in 1967 was awarded an Italian Scholarship to study in Florence. A painter of portraits and landscapes he taught at the National College of Art & Design and later became an Inspector of Art for the Department of Education.


He was a founder director of the Project Arts Centre in Dublin, and also founded the Gorey Arts Centre and Gorey Arts Festival which ran from 1970 to the mid 1980's. The festival was held during July & August. Many of the country's top entertainers performed at this festival including Chris De Burgh, Makem & Clancy, Horslips, Christy Moore, Planxty, Niall Toibin.

In 1980 he brought a young band to the closing night of the Arts Festival that band was U2. The Arts Centre was located at the back of Funge's shop. Paul Funge passed away on February 21st 2011.


