James Pelan was born in 1844 to Samuel and Elizabeth Pelan. They had purchased the lease on the Royal Hotel [Ebbs'] in 1840. Samuel died in 1845 aged 47 years old. Elizabeth was left with 4 very young children. Samuel was described as a merchant and shopkeeper on the children's baptismal records but there was also a public licence on the premises. James took over the premises on the death of his mother in 1882. James married Sarah Johnston Fullerton of Sharrygroom Co Tyrone the daughter of Stewart Fullerton a minister in the C of I in Dublin in 1883. They had 3 children Elizabeth born 1884 Mary born 1890 and Samuel born 1893. There is no household form for the 1901 census for Pelans but their presence is noted on the Enumerator's form. James and Sarah died in Nov and Dec 1905 just 19 days apart. Their daughter Elizabeth was the informant for both. Elizabeth married William Scott who had property in Gorey. At the time of their marriage he was a miller in Nenagh as was the case in 1911 where it was noted they had 2 children.

Edward Lacey son of Edward a farmer married Elizabeth Hall, the daughter of Laurence a farmer in 1901 in Ferns. He was a merchant in Ballycanew at the time of marriage and his wife was named as the licencee. When he died in 1936 he was succeeded by his son Pat who was born in 1911. Pat retired in 1982 when Eamon Smith and his wife bought it and continued to run it as a public house but also introduced freshly cooked piazza to Gorey.
