Martha Earle died in 1884 at the age of 98. She is described as being the widow of a baker. Her son James Earle presumably continued the business until 1885. He lived till 1908 and is buried in the Market Sq aged 88 years. He is described as being a photographer and farmer on his death cert.

James Redmond was a victualler who was married to Mary Nolan and is referred to as being a widower in 1901 census as Mary had died in 1899. As all the participants in this survey have found out there were numerous butchers/victuallers who were named Redmond but also had the surnames Michael, James and Patrick. They also moved from premises to premises at intervals and the addresses given on the certificates

were reduced to Gorey so it has proved difficult to separate out the different Redmond families who made their living on the Main St of Gorey. A case in point is the presence of 4 Michael Redmonds who were butchers on the Main st in the 1901 census as well as 2 Redmond shopkeepers called Michael and an hotel manager also called Michael Redmond.

Michael Redmond was a son of James Redmond and Mary Nolan who was born in 1867 in Gorey. He went on to become a butcher like his father and took over the family business on the death of his father in 1914. He had married Ann O'Toole from Avoca in 1899. Ann's father John was listed as a farmer. They had a daughter Mary Ann. Michael Redmond died in 1921 from hepatitis.

William Hargrove was a Laois man who was born in 1892 to Thomas Hargrove and Eliza Donnolly. Thomas was listed on the birth certs as a labourer and a miller and maybe a colour sergeant on one of his older children's birth cert. Eliza stated on the 1911 census of being the mother of 12 children born and 12 children living. William is listed as being a "shopman grocer "and residing in Barrack St Tullamore in the 1911 census in a property with John Byrne as head of the family. There was a total of 8 people listed as workers in the Tullamore premises . He was in Gorey by 1917 as he is mentioned in a newspaper report as having given a fine rendition of several songs along with his future wife Lena Wall. He was very active in the local community .Among his contributions was being one of a team who revived the Gorey Musical Society. He was secretary of the Temperance and Social Club which is still in existence. He got involved in restarting a GAA club as well as being a fine golfer as can be seen from the reports in the local newspapers where he featured regularly. He married Lena Wall also of the Main St Gorey in the UCD church on Stephen's Green in 1919. His wife Lena was also a golfer and also took part in the local musical society

shows and concerts. Lena Wall was a daughter of Henry Wall draper [now no 71 Main St] and Mary Hutcheson both originally from Kilkenny. [See no 71 Main St for Wall family tree] William Hargrove ran a successful business till 1958 when he died suddenly. His wife Lena died in Kilrush Co Clare in 1966 by which time only 2 of their 5 children were alive.

Margaret O'Connell had the premises for a short while in 1958/1959

Thomas Hurney and his Wife Rita ran a successful furniture and fancy goods store from 1959 till 1998.
