The Brochure advertising the sale of Stephen Ram's property in Gorey in 1870 stated that Michael Stafford was the tenant or person entitled to rights. He had a 41 year lease and paid a rent of seven pounds per year, holding 35 and a half perches of land, (898 square meters). Stafford also had a mortgage of £300 registered on the premises. Stafford also subsequently appears as the landlord with James Redmond as the tenant. James Redmond, aged 45, a public house keeper is recorded as having died in 1892

In 1886 Margaret Redmond, aged 46, a publican is recorded as having died. In 1896, Michael Redmond is recorded as having contributed five shillings to a fund to plant trees in Gorey. In all, 103 trees were planted, comprising of Lime, Chestnut and English Elm. The South Parade, (today's Avenue) was planted as were other areas of the town.

Michael J was born on 6 June 1870 to James, a shopkeeper and Margaret (formerly Teahon). In 1899, Michael J married Bridget Kavanagh of Ballygarett. The 1901 Census recorded that they lived here operating a shop. His brothers Patrick and Sylvester as well as his sister Grace and his sister in law also lived here. The 1911 census recorded James and Bridget, their son James and three others lived here. The premises were described as a licensed premises. In 1914, Michael J Redmond died aged 45 years.

Bridget Redmond, a shopkeeper aged 42, died in 1920. Sarah Kavanagh of Ballygarett was recorded as present at the deaths of Michael J, and Bridget

James is remembered in Gorey as a successful businessman with several enterprises in the town. Local memory remembers 64 Main Street as Gorey's first "supermarket". He died in 1960 aged 53 and is buried alongside his parents James J and Bridget in St Michaels Cemetery, Gorey. He never married. Phil and Anne Brennan and family owned and operated this popular public house from 1965.
