Erected by Samuel Stuart Gorey in memory of his son Thomas Stuart who died Nov. 18th 1834 aged 26 years.

Also Elizabeth his beloved wife who died Oct. 8th 1876 aged 81 years.

The remains of the afore said Samuel Stuart are deposited here, he died on 4th March 1878 aged 76 years.

Also those of his daughter Anne who died August 10th 1879 aged 46 yrs.

His son William died 12th April 1918.

His daughter-in-law Elizabeth died 16th July 1933.

His grandchildren Charles 5th ? 1896.

Lillie died 26th June 1909.

Thomas died 27th April 1939.

Tom Stuart, son of Anne Earl & William Stuart, lived at No. 7 main Street. He was a Plumber & a Carpenter. He died at 57 years & is buried in Market Square Gorey. He never married. He rode a penny-farthing bicycle. His brother Samuel had a shoe shop next door. Another brother William went to the USA.

Laurence Lar Murphy bought No 7 main Street in the 1940s. He was born in Ballinacoola Craanford to Moses Murphy (Monbay) & Mary Ann Kinsella. He grew up in Belcarrig near Ballyoughter. He married Bridget Doyle from the Brackernagh & had two children Aidan & Elizabeth. Aidan married Eileen Dwyer & had three children. Laurence was an undertaker & his wife ran a grocery & a chip shop with petrol pumps on the Main street. His son Aidan & grandson carry on the Undertaking business today & run a very successful coffee shop.
