DEEP SADNESS and regret were expressed following the passing of Josephine Roice, late of Knockevan, Gorey Hill Upper, Gorey, at Wexford Hospital on March 14 last at the age of 84. A native of Castleisland, Co. Kerry, Josephine (nee McCrohan) was born in December 1924. Her mother Annie Flynn was a primary school teacher, and her father Paul a Station Master with the Great Southern and Western Railways.

As a result, the family lived in various towns around the country including Boris, and finally Campile.

In August 1940, Josephine and her sister Frances were lucky to escape serious injury when German bombs fell in Campile. The Railway House was badly damaged, and the Shelbourne Co-operative Stores was the scene of the deaths of three young girls that August day. A few years later, David Roice, a native of Wexford town, became the first Pharmacist in the Shelbourne Co-op. This led to the start of a new life for Josephine McCrohan and David Roice.

They married in September 1946. David had, in the previous year, opened his own Pharmacy at 90 Main Street, Gorey. Within a few years, they moved their business to 76 Main Street, where they lived and raised their family.

Ahead of her times in the 1950s/1960s, Josephine was a full-time working mother – rearing five daughters and working with her husband in their Pharmacy. A beautiful singer and piano player, she still found time during those busy years to entertain friends and family. For over 30 years, her games of Bridge gave Josephine great enjoyment. She was made an Honorary Life Member of both the Tara Bridge Club and the Green Bridge Club as a result of her great contribution. She was a great card player and enjoyed the friendship she encountered while playing Bridge with both these clubs, of which she was a founding member, as well as with the 51 Bridge Club.

The esteem with which she was held was evident by the Guard of Honour provided by members of these clubs when she left St. Michael's Church, Gorey, for the last time on her way to her final resting place.

The late Mrs Roice is survived by her daughters Mary, Frances, Jo, and Carmel, sister, Frances, brother-in-law Eamon, nieces, sons-in-law, neighbours, relatives and many friends.

A huge debt of gratitude is due to Mary Roice who was instrumental in researching and publishing a list of all those interred in St Michaels Cemetery, Gorey. This facility may be
