

Nathanial Cooke, listed as a draper was already widowed by 1901 having lost his wife Susan nee Buchanan on the 16th July 1889 at the age of 49.

His sister in law Isabella Buchanan ran the household. The shop employed eleven people including Nathanial's, daughters Anne and Margaret, son Herbert seven assistants and there were two servants employed. Another daughter Isabella Cooke married John Hamilton a draper in Arklow town on 5th January 1891.





Obitruary for Dr Lorna Johnson nee Cooke last of the Cooke family to conduct business at 83/84 Main Street

Having led a long and interesting life, Dr. Lorna Johnston of Gorey died on January 28 last.

Born Lorna Aileen Cooke in 1908, she was the eldest child of Herbert T. and Esther Cooke and grew up in the house of her grandfather Nathaniel Cooke, founder of Cooke's Arcade. Mrs. Mercer of Charlotte Row, Gorey, provided her early schooling, and at the age of eleven, she continued her education at Methodist College, Belfast.

She attended Queen's University, Belfast, where she studied Medicine. It was there that she met her future husband, William Scott Johnston, an Arts student who also attended Edgehill Theological College, prior to Ordination as a Methodist Minister.

Dr. Johnston graduated with her MD in 1931 and took a position as House Surgeon in the Women's and Children's Hospital in Manchester, England. In April 1933, she travelled to Ceylon, where she married Scott Johnston. From there, the couple travelled to China, where they worked with the Methodist Mission Schools in Fatshan near Canton, South China.

In 1937, when the Japanese bombed Canton, she left China with her three children and sailed home to Ireland. Her husband Scott followed two years later.

Subsequently, they settled in Cooke's Arcade as proprietors. In addition to running the business and raising her family, she was organist at Gorey Methodist Church.

She also managed to find time to be an active member of the Gorey branch of the Red Cross, and ran a Well Baby Clinic, and for years, organised the Blood Donor Clinics for the Blood Transfusion Service.



In the 1980's John Nolan very successful Gorey business man ran a Drapery Business at 83/84 Main Street after purchasing the premises and business from Stephen and Mary Charlotte Johnson nee Cooke. This ended the three generation's the Cooke family residing and running a business at 83/84 Main Street
