The Reddy Family

The Reddy Family occupied Number 37 Main Street Gorey from 1880's and into the early 20th century. The business operated as a drapers.

The Reddy Family were of four sisters; Elizabeth, Mary, Catherine (Katie) and Bridget. Their father was Patrick Reddy who was a farmer. The Reddy's originate from Askamore.

In 1901 James Warrington worked as a watchmaker in Ebb's Jewellers (Mary James now occupies this building as a Jewellers).

James Warrington was born in County Dublin as noted in the 1901 census. His father was Peter Warrington also a watchmaker.

James Warrington married Bridget Mary Reddy on the 22nd of August 1904. They lived in Pearse Street.

Bridget Warrington died in 1914 aged 39 years and is buried in St. Michael's Cemetery, Gorey.

James Warrington died in 1936 and is also buried in St. Michaels Cemetery, Gorey.

Elizabeth date died 17/05/1918 aged 50 yrs and is buried in St. Michaels Gorey. Elizabeth never married; she worked as a milliner – her sister Kate Reddy was present at her death.

Catherine Reddy died 1/02/1935 aged 78 yrs and is buried in St. Michaels Gorey; Kate's death is recorded at Church Street, Gorey. Her sister in law Frances Warrington was present at her death.

Mary Reddy died 6th January 1941 aged 84 yrs and is buried in St. Michaels Gorey. Her death is recorded at St. Michaels Place – her occupation was dress maker. Fiona Warrington was present at her death of Georges Street (now Pearse Street).

The Travers Family; lived at No. 37 Main Street after the Reddy's. They also bought No. 38 Main Street.

In Thom's Directory of 1949; the businesses are recorded as "Fruiterer". No 37 is recorded as M. Travers and No.38 is recorded as E. Travers.

Myles Travers ran a hairdressing and salon business here on 37 main street. Upstairs over the property was the Central Hotel & Restaurant.

No 38 was ran as a drapery and boot stores.

A descendent of the family – Milo Traver's became a town photographer during the 1940's and 1950's operating under the name The Crystal Photo Service Gorey.
