The Redmond Family of No 39 & No 40 Main Street Gorey.

The Redmond Family occupied No 39 and No 40 Main Street Gorey for many years.

In the image below you can see both shops; one had Irish lettering on No 39, whilst next door No.40 had English lettering version of the Redmond name.

As you can observe; No 39 and No 40 has now been converted in modern times into a larger unit shop with an access door to the restaurant upstairs.

The shop was run as a butcher for many years.

Michael Redmond born approx. 1848 and died in 1906; was married to Anne born 1848 and died in 1918; their children included Michael Redmond born approx. 1876 who also worked as a butcher; and his sister Mary Anne; there were 2 other children as well but these are not recorded on the 1901 census.

According to the 1911 census there were 6 children born with 4 children living. The four children are: Michael, Margaret Mary, Ellen and Mary Anne.

Michael Redmond married Maria; their children were Michael, Sybil, Gretta and Anna May.

Their son Michael later inherited the business on Main Street and did not marry.

Anna May married Matthew Nolan of Thomas Street; Matthew also worked in the premises and managed the butcher shop.

In modern times; the shop of No 39 and No 40 have been combined into one larger shop unit.
