Stephens Family

Arthur Herbert Stephens rented the property from the representatives of Alicia Kirk.

Arthur H. Stephen's then bought the property after 1930.

Arthur Stephen's was born in 1892 and he married a Sarah Kavanagh on 23rd June 1920. She was more commonly known as Sal.

Arthur Stephen's ran a number of different businesses here.

At one stage he ran a hackney service; as well as a draper shop in the business.

He subsequently let the shop to **George Paskin's** who ran it as a jewellery shop.

Paskins Jeweller's

George Paskins started off working as a Jeweller's in No 7 Main Street Gorey.

George Paskin's then moved further up the Main Street to Number 41 where he ran his jewellery business.

George Paskin's name does not appear in the cancellations book for this property; as it was the property of Arthur Stephens.

George rented the front shop for many years and ran a successful jewellery business.

George married Dora Price on the 16th May 1929.

He did not live in the shop; he lived in Courtown on the Main Street.

George Paskin's father - John Paskins was the game keeper on the Courtown Estate.

Dora Price's father - John Price was a sea captain. The Paskin's are buried in Prospect – Ballymoney and Christ Church in Gorey.

Robert Paskins was an uncle of George Paskins; and Robert had a business as Provision Merchant in 1901 census at No 46 Main Street.

The shop is now divided into three smaller businesses in 2019 – a jewellers shop, another shop and the No 41 restaurant upstairs.
