The Kenny's of No 43 Main Street (on corner of North Parade/Main Street)

This shop was located on the corner of North Parade- Main Street.

The shop was run as a sweet & ice-cream shop by the Kenny Family for many years.

Cecelia Kenny (nee McDonald) ran the business here and she was married in 1945 to Denis Kenny.

They had a large family. Denis Kenny was born in 1907 and died 22nd April 1956.

Denis Kenny also was a partner of Denis Allen who ran an auctioneer on The Avenue and it was known as Allen & Kenny Auctioneers.

Denis Kenny was also the town rate collector.

When Denis died in 1956; his address is given as No 43 main street gorey on his death certificate.

It should be No 44; which is due to errors in numbering on the main street.

When Denis died; his wife Cecelia continued to run the business and collect the rates.

Today the business is run as Tara Stores which operates as a curtain, carpets and habadashery.
