This shop at No 46 Main Street which is a large fronted three storey building; is now incorporated into the shop next door (No 47) as a larger retail unit operating in modern times.

The shop was occupied for many years by McCormack Brothers who ran a hardware business here; which also extended out in the back yard behind the property.

The Richards Family of Main Street Gorey

Robert Richards is recorded as being an occupier from 1874-1881 at Number 46 Main Street Gorey.

The Richards Family were of Gorey, Wexford Town and London.

The family were noted clock makers; with some clocks still ticking away around Gorey.

Robert Richards is buried in Ardamine; Courtown in the Church of Ireland Graveyard with other members of the family.

Robert Richards married Emma Richards and they had a large family.

A son Thomas H. Richards was born 19th March 1843. Thomas H. Richards established a highly successful business in Wexford Town as a Jewellers; and followed in the esteemed trade of his father.

Other members of the family included Shephera born 1845, Susana born 1847, Robert Junior born 1848, Frances born 1850, Edward born 1852, and Sarah born 1854. There may have been other children born as well.

Robert Richards advertised in 1849 the following: 27th January 1849 to be sold an interest in a lease for an unexpired term of 99 years seven two storey dwelling houses, with yards at the rear; and situated in Wexford Street (Castle Street), Gorey, County Wexford.

These houses were built in the year 1846.
