The Fennell Family

Edward Fennell ran a grocery business with his wife Catherine Kavanagh at No 48 from the 1850's to 1880's.

Edward died in 1879 and his wife Catherine continued running the grocery business.

Their son John Fennell continued in the family trade and ran a grocery and fruit shop in 42 Main Street.

In 1892 William Walker bought the property.

The Walker Family

William Walker was a shoe-maker and sexton in Christchurch Gorey.

In 1901 he was not married as recorded in the census.
