

Edward died in 1879 and his wife Catherine continued running the grocery business.


Their son John Fennell continued in the family trade and ran a grocery and fruit shop in 42 Main Street.




William Walker and his wife Annie are buried in Christ Church Gorey; both died in 1926 – see headstone above.
