James Redmond was a butcher and cattle dealer who ran a successful business at No 92 Main Street Gorey for many years.

The house at this time as can be seen from the photograph below was both the business and home for the family.



James Redmond's youngest son -Patrick Redmond died aged 26 years on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> June 1914. He had been ailing for some-time.

During the funeral; as the cortege passed the deceased's late residence his home place at 92 Main Street Gorey, his mother who was very much attached to him, catching sight of the coffin collapsed; overcome by grief and was removed to bed and the doctor and priest was called for.

She died at 6.30 that evening on 30<sup>th</sup> June, not with-standing skilful medical treatment.

Owing to the illness of her dear son which had been of long duration, she had not been in robust health latterly.

The occurrence has cast a gloom over the whole town where the Redmond Family are held in the highest regard.

James Redmond (father of the family) died 10<sup>th</sup> December 1914.
