### **The Barrington's – A Tailoring Family of Gorey**

The Barrington Family were a family of Tailors and lived and worked at No 93 Main Street Gorey.

They had occupied a property down further on the street but swapped with the Webb's family.

They had also lived in Esmonde Street.

The premises now in 2018 operates as a café called Partridges; which in modern times has taken over the premises as well next door on the left-hand side (no 94).

The shop façade has kept some of its style and heritage over the intervening years as can be seen in the traditional style shop front which existed when Barrington's ran a tailoring business.

Edward Barrington married Catherine Kane on the 9<sup>th</sup> November 1899 in Askamore.

Edward's occupation was tailor; Catherine's was a farmer.

There were four children recorded born to the marriage with 3 children alive in 1911:

John born 1900, Mary Anne (or Ellen) born 1904 – died 1905; Katie born 1906; and Edward born 1909.

Another child Richard J Barrington was born in 1913 and died in 1913 after 4 days.

These deaths are recorded on the headstone in St. Michael's Cemetery.

Edward Barrington died 17<sup>th</sup> January 1917 aged 42 and left £210 pounds to his widow Kate Barrington.

The two sons Eddie and John followed into their father's footsteps and worked as tailors in the Family Business.

Kate Barrington died on October 28<sup>th</sup> 1951 aged 82 years.

Their son Edward Barrington married Sarah Byrne of Monaseed in 1948.

Edward died on 9<sup>th</sup> May 1986 aged 76 years.

His wife Sarah (Sadie) Barrington died on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 1990 aged 76 years.

Edward and Sarah had two sons Edward (known as Teddy) and James (Jim) Barrington.

Edward (Teddy) Barrington became a diplomat and was also ambassador for Ireland to the United Kingdom from September 1995 to September 2001. He is now retired and living in County Wexford.

John (Jack) Barrington died on January 24<sup>th</sup> 1979 and is buried in the family grave.
