The Redmond Family - Butchers

Number 94 Main Street Gorey has seen many different types of shop over the years.

Currently in 2018 it is run as a café known as Partridge's and is combined with the building next door at Number 93 (formerly Barringtons)

In 1901 in the census – Mary Redmond is recorded with her son's Michael, William, Moses and daughters Catherine and Sarah.

The family ran a victualling business.

By 1915 the family had left the property with Roe Hobbs taking over and running a shoe shop.

The Hobb's Family

From approximately 1915 Owen Roe Hobbs ran a shoe shop here for a number of years at No 94.

For a period Owen Roe Hobbs was a tenant paying rent to Mary Fowler landlord but eventually Roe Hobbs bought the premises and became the landlord of the property himself.

Owen Roe Hobbs married Catherine Naughter of Gorey and they had two daughters Nancy (later became Stafford) and Maura (later became Lalor). Owen Roe Hobb's died tragically in 1958 in an automobile accident.

Owen Roe Hobbs and his family did not live over the business; they lived down at the Cooch Road.

The Neylon's Family

James Neylon married Mary Anne Lacey on June 23rd 1926 in St. Michael's Chapel Gorey. James Neylon was a member of the Civic Guard. Mary's father also had pub on Main Street – he was Edward Lacey.

The Neylon's had a sweet shop and they were the first to have an ice-cream parlour in Gorey and later on a ladies hair dressing salon. Mrs Neylon was widowed young. Her daughter Philomena also helped in the business.
