

Their family business was bakers hence the nickname "Cake".

The Ryan Family

The Ryan's came to Gorey in the years of 1930-1931. They hailed from Loggan, near Tinahealy, County Wicklow.

The two Ryan sisters (Elizabeth and Margaret) ran a successful tea-room or café and boarding house for many years up until 1965 in the property which was previously occupied by the Cake Travers.

The Ryan's are buried in Rathvilly, Carlow, County Carlow where they retired.

The property then passed to Reginald Blackmore in 1971 where he operated the first self-service supermarket in Gorey for many years.
