
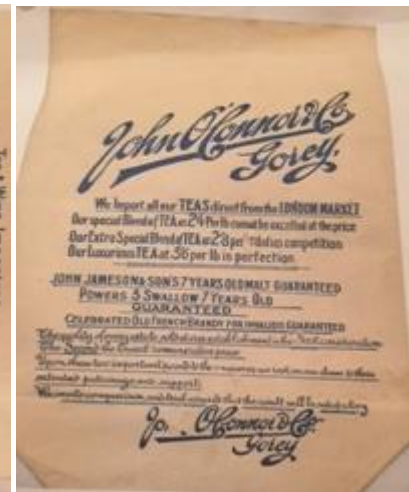
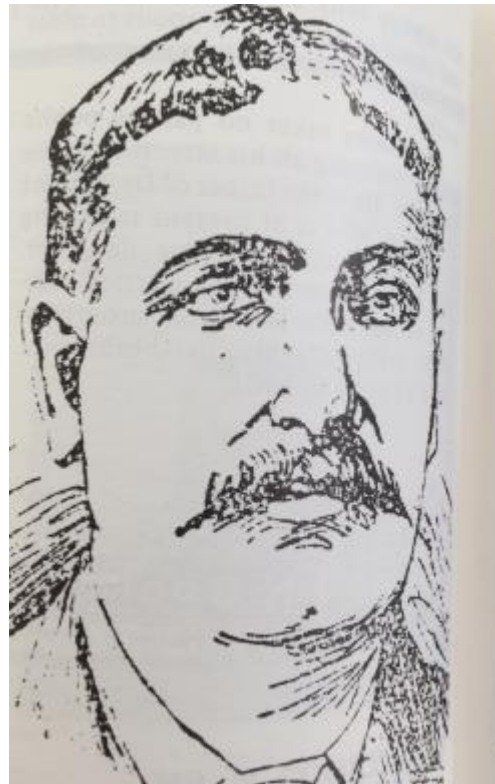

1892 Bates Gorey: Notice of Removal of Mrs Jane Bates wife of Edward Bates Main St was a daughter of Benjamin Webster Contractor Gorey.

Her sons Benjamin & Charles Bates who inherited the Bates property which was sold to the former well known businessman Mr John O'Connor 82 Main St Gorey & later to his nephew Mr Patrick (Paddy)O'Connor.

Charles Bates who was returning to Africa where he had been living died suddenly at Bournemouth & left his inheritance to two elder Websters who were his cousins.

Mr John Bates had an Auctioneering Business at Gorey.

The Coach Builders "Bates & Sons" were relatives.





Mr Paddy O Connor was a native of Ferbane Co Offaly. He was a nephew of John O'Connor.
